IMPACT

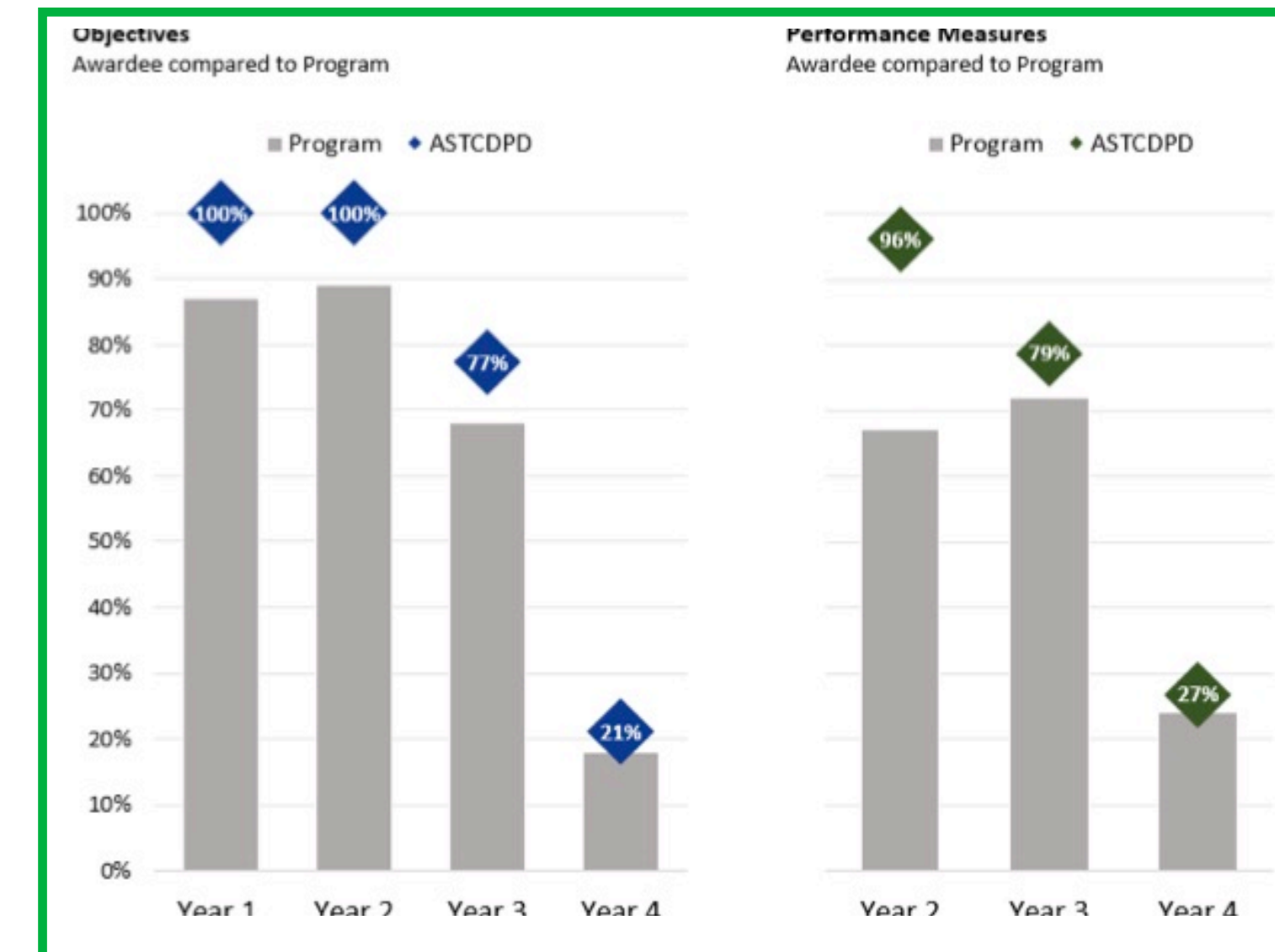
OSTLTS Funding has allowed NACDD to:
