


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U.S. ASSOCIATED PACIFIC ISLANDS

PACIFIC CARE MODEL

The Pacific Care Model (PCM) focuses the value of local knowledge, cultural strengths, and traditional practices as an organizing framework for the Pacific NCD Collaborative Initiative. Throughout the Pacific, the canoe was traditionally a part of life. Successful journeys depended on a skilled navigator, capable captain, and crew members working collectively to navigate toward their goal, the destination.

Likewise, the PCM helps guide collaborative teams to stay on course, collective in their goal to transform health care systems and expand community and clinical linkages. The navigating stars, shown in the PCM, depict the six key elements that guide health system change to ensure good communication (represented by the canoe mast) between the patient and health care team—which leads to patient and family centered services and improved health outcomes.
