Andrew S Narva, MD, FACP, FASN

Dr. Narva became the director of the National Kidney Disease Education Program at the National Institutes of Health in September 2006. From 1989 through 2006 he served as the Chief Clinical Consultant for Nephrology for the Indian Health Service (IHS), an agency of the Public Health Service providing healthcare to over one million American Indians and Alaska Natives. He has served as a member of the Medical Review Board of ESRD Network 15, a member of the NKF KDOQI Work Group on Diabetes in Chronic Diabetes, a member of Working Group on CKD, International Federation of Clinical Chemistry and Laboratory Medicine and as a member of the JNC 8 Expert Panel. In 2002 Dr. Narva was recognized by the US Public Health Service as the Clinical Physician of the Year. Although Dr. Narva now works at NIH, he continues to serve as the Chief Clinical Consultant for Nephrology for IHS. He provides direct care at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and via telemedicine at Zuni Indian Hospital in Zuni, New Mexico.

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
