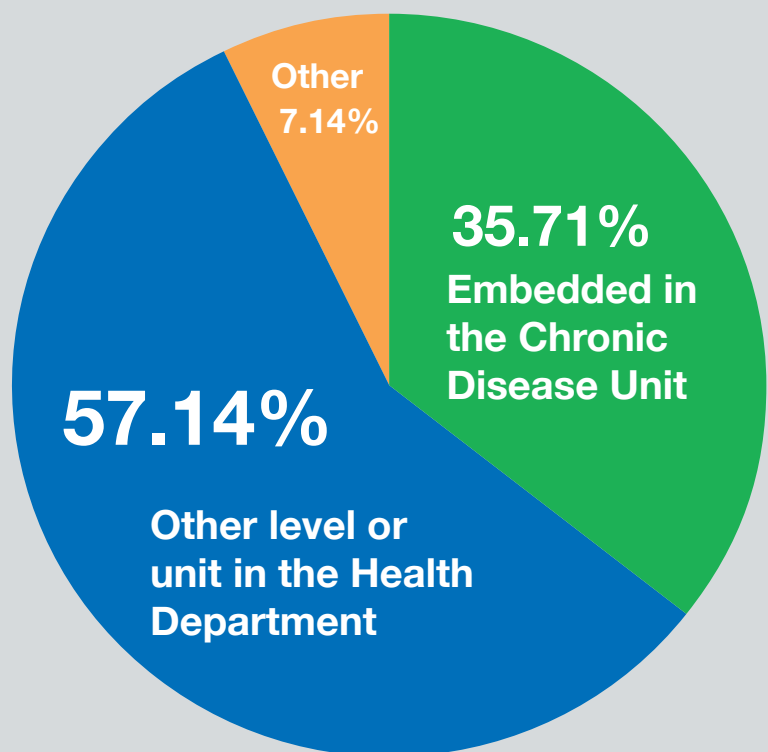




# Chronic Disease Directors Weigh In On Block Grant Survey Impact

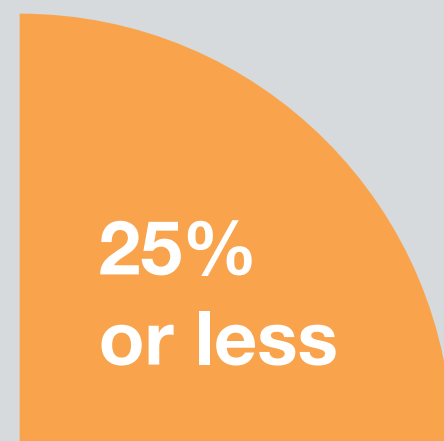
