

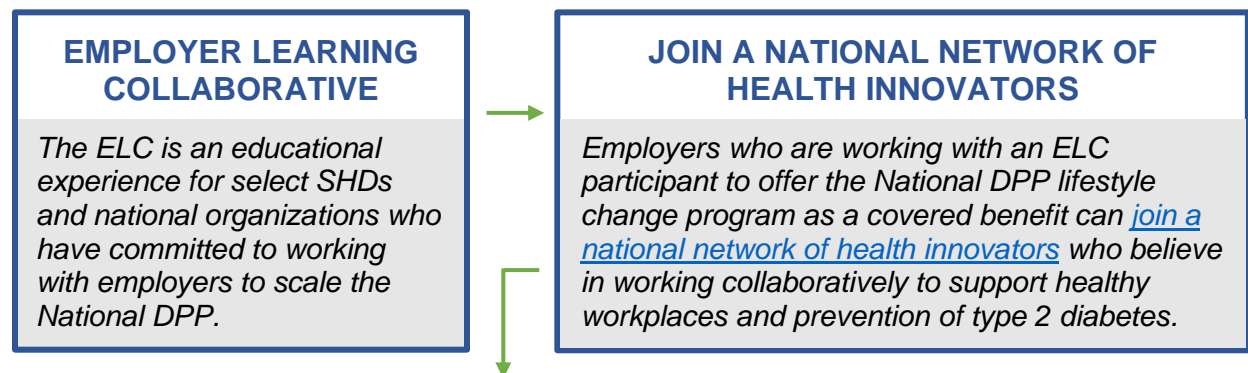
# EMPLOYER NETWORK
