

2015-2020 Breast & Cervical Key Highlights

Women's & Men's Health Programs

Every Woman Matters (EWM) within the Women's and Men's Health Program at the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services (NDHHS) is in its 30th year of implementing breast and cervical cancer screening across the state of Nebraska. Funding is awarded by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

In addition to breast and cervical cancer screenings, Nebraska also offers cardiovascular and diabetes screening as well as colon cancer screening.

282,000 Pap test and Mammograms*

Approximately 488 health care clinics/offices across the state perform services.

Women eligible for screening services through Every Woman Matters are 40-64 years of age for mammograms and 21-64 years of age for Pap Smears or HPV tests, fall within the program's income guidelines and are not Medicaid beneficiaries nor do they have adequate insurance coverage. The income guidelines are at or below 225% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. The program also provides diagnostic services for those eligible women.

Between January 2015 and December 2020, more than 23,566 clients were enrolled in the program. 63% (14,889) were first time enrollees.

Of the **23,566** enrolled during the last 5 years:

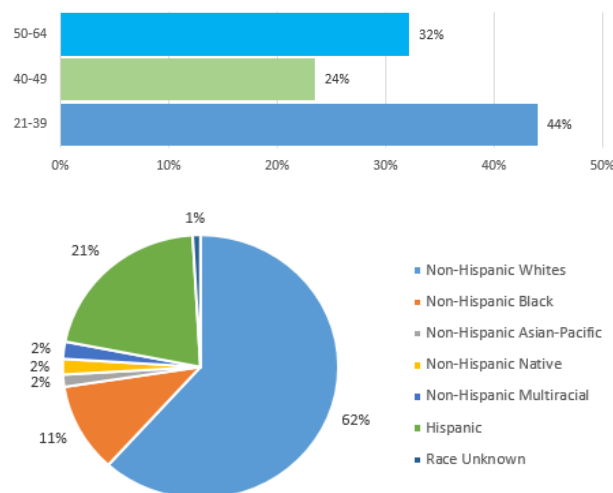
- 11,765 clients were enrolled in the State Pap Plus Program (*Program for women <40 years of age*)
- 1,192 were enrolled for diagnostic services

- 63% of program participants are at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (6,723)
- 95% have no insurance (10,055)

TESTS PERFORMED (January 2015 – December 2020)

- 6,237 mammograms
 - 22% abnormal mammograms
 - 6 Atypical Hyperplasia
 - 159 Invasive Cancer
 - 30 Ductal Carcinoma In Situ
 - 3 Lobular Carcinoma In Situ
- 6,097 Pap Smears
 - 16% abnormal Pap tests
 - 66 Carcinoma In Situ
 - 8 Invasive Cervical Carcinoma
 - 2 Squamous Cell Carcinoma
