



What is the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program?

It is a program of the Maine CDC, DHHS that

pays for breast and cervical screenings such as breast exams, mammograms and Pap tests for women who qualify.

I am getting treatment for breast or cervical cancer but I do not qualify for MaineCare. Can MBCHP help me?

We cannot pay your medical bills, but we can link you with other resources. Call the MBCHP at 1-800-350-5180 and press 1, or 207-287-8068, and ask to speak with the Patient Navigator.

I am already enrolled in MaineCare. What should I do?

You do not need to apply again for this benefit.

If I have insurance, can I still get this MaineCare option?

If you have insurance that covers treatment, even if you have a high deductible, you are not eligible.

Sometimes if you have other insurance that will not cover a pre-existing condition, you can get this option. A pre-existing condition clause means your insurance company will not cover treatment services because you had cancer before your insurance policy started.

How do I know if I qualify for MaineCare for my breast or cervical treatment?

You qualify if you meet all of the following:

- You have been seen by a provider or a mammography facility enrolled in the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program (MBCHP)
- You have been diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer or a pre-cancerous breast or cervical condition
- You need treatment for these types of cancer
- You are 40-64 years old*
- You have no insurance or have insurance that does not pay any part of the cancer treatment
- You meet certain income guidelines

What will MaineCare pay for?

MaineCare will pay for cancer treatment services such as:

- LEEP
- Mastectomy
- Lumpectomy
- Radiation
- Chemotherapy
- Tamoxifen/Arimidex

Other MaineCare covered services include:

- Mental health and substance abuse services
- Transportation to MaineCare covered services, if you qualify
- Provider visits
- Hospital services
- Prescription and some over-the-counter medications



If I am enrolled in MaineCare, who do I call for information on covered services?

Once you are enrolled in MaineCare under this option, call MaineCare Member Services.

They will answer any questions regarding covered services.

How long can I get this option?

You qualify as long as you are in treatment for breast or cervical cancer or pre-cancerous lesions and have no other health insurance. Your case will be reviewed each year.

How do I get this MaineCare Option?

Call the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program at 1-800-350-5180 and press 1, or 207-287-8068. If you qualify, they will enroll you in MaineCare.
