Our Model




The purpose of the Medicaid Umbrella Hub
Organization (UHO) project is to build state
capacity to develop an Umbrella Hub
Arrangement (UHA). The UHA aims to increase
Medicaid beneficiary access and enrollment in
the National Diabetes Prevention Program
(DPP) by establishing the National Kidney
Foundation of Michigan (NKFM) as the first
Michigan DPP UHO. Simultaneously, NKFM will
work to enroll 65 Medicaid beneficiaries in DPP.
This project moved us in the direction we
needed for the grant.


