LEAP (Learn. Explore. Activate. Problem-solve.) Learning Labs are topic-specific group-based learning opportunities offered through a collaboration between the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the National Association of Chronic Disease Directors (NACDD) to help State Health Departments actively pursue new or enhanced approaches for scaling and sustaining the National Diabetes Prevention Program (National DPP). LEAP Learning Lab participants learn and contribute to identifying promising practices, effective tools, and resources.

- Identify resources and opportunities to increase awareness of prediabetes and the MDPP benefit.
- Advance enrollment through screening, testing, and referral of eligible Medicare beneficiaries into the MDPP.
- Hear key insights from the MDPP Enrollment Project.
- Discuss strategy on how to build a diabetes prevention ecosystem in your state.

- Understand State Health Department roles in increasing MDPP beneficiary enrollment into the MDPP.
- Collaborate with MDPP suppliers and partners to take steps to increase Medicare beneficiary enrollment into the MDPP.
