Society for Public Health Education (SOPHE) Action Institute Announcement

 On January 17-20th, 2023 from 12:00 to 4:00 PM ET, SOPHE and the Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity and Obesity (DNPAO) will host another Integrating Nutrition and Intercultural Competency in the Charitable Food System Action Institute. The goal of the 2023 virtual Action Institute is to bring together elected interdisciplinary teams from recipient programs to receive focused technical assistance and utilize protected team time for action planning. Potential topic areas for action include facilitating the adoption of the <u>Healthy Eating Research (HER) Nutrition Guidelines for the Charitable Food</u> <u>System</u>, enhancing intercultural competency practices and, and creating nutrition policies at the food bank and/or food pantry level. The outcomes of this work can improve the neighbor experience when accessing the charitable food system and ensure that their food needs and preferences are met.
