





Arizona Food and Nutrition Security State Profile

Overview

According to the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA ERS)</u>, 11.0% of households in Arizona (Ariz.) experienced food insecurity between 2018-2020. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in Arizona was 30.9% in 2020, as reported by the <u>Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)</u>.

Demographic Overview

2019 U.S. Census data reports that Arizona has an estimated population of 7,278,717. They identify as white (82.6%), Black (5.2%), American Indian and Alaska Native (5.3%), Asian (3.7%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.3%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 31.7% identify as Hispanic or Latino. In 2019,13.5% of Arizona residents experienced poverty.
