





North Dakota Food and Nutrition Security State Profile

Overview

According to the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA ERS)</u>, 7.9% of households in North Dakota (N.D.) experienced food insecurity between 2018-2020. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in N.D. was 33.1% in 2020, as reported by the <u>Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)</u>.

Demographic Overview

2019 U.S. Census data reports N.D. has an estimated population of 762,062. They identify as white (86.9%), Black (3.4%), American Indian and Alaska Native (5.6%), Asian (1.7%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.1%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 4.1% identify as Hispanic or Latino. In 2019, 10.6% of N.D. residents experienced poverty.
