### **SPINE Shoutout**

This month we are shouting out **Iowa**! The Iowa SPINE team leads the Iowa Nutrition Network Partnership (INNP), a group of Iowa stakeholders that work with the USDA and other federally funded nutrition programs. The group has been working towards a strategic plan for the past year with the hopes of it to provide direction in creating action steps with policy, systems and environmental (PSE) changes in addressing food and nutrition security throughout the state. The INNP recently released a report in partnership with Altarum titled, "<u>Best Practices in</u> <u>Addressing Food and Nutrition Security with Policy, Systems and Environmental Change</u> <u>Projects</u>." This report pulls information from grey literature and a nationwide scan of food policy councils, food plans and SNACs (State Nutrition Action Councils). The report will be used to inform the INNP's strategic and evaluation plans. Additionally, the Iowa team has partnered with the University of Iowa to conduct a survey and follow up interviews with Iowa stakeholders exploring organizations utilization of and interest in PSE changes to address food and nutrition security.

### Food and Nutrition Security

• <u>Healthy Food Policy Project</u>. The Healthy Food Policy Project (HFPP) identifies and elevates local laws that seek to promote access to healthy food while also contributing to strong local economies, an improved environment, and health equity, with a focus on socially disadvantaged and marginalized groups.

### **Power-Building Partnerships for Health**

<u>Power-building Partnerships for Health</u> cultivates powerful collaborations between local health departments and community power-building organizations to advance health equity. Human Impact Partners has released a <u>call for applications</u> for health departments and community power-building organizations to participate in the 2023 Power-building Partnerships for Health, a nine-month program to build relationships, trust, and strategic actions together. 30K is being granted to support community organizers' time and participation and support power-building activities. # Active People, Healthy Nation Walkability Virtual Academy (WVA) Request for Funding Assistance
