• <u>Healthy Eating Research</u> call for proposals. This award aims to fund research on supportive family policies and programs that have strong potential to impact equitable access to nutritious food in communities, nutrition security, diet quality, and improved nutrition and health outcomes. Concept papers due by April 5, 2023. Apply here.

- <u>Nutrition Incentive Program Training</u>, <u>Technical Assistance</u>, <u>Evaluation</u>, and <u>Information Center</u> had made available grants between \$5,000 and \$25,000 each for capacity building support to organizations who have not yet applied to or not yet successfully been awarded a <u>Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP)</u> or Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive (FINI) award. Applications are due February 13, 2023. <u>Apply here</u>.
- WIC Community Innovation and Outreach (WIC CIAO) Project Team is pleased to make available funding through a Request for Application to WIC State and local agencies, including Indian Tribal Organizations (ITOs), and nonprofit entities and organizations to develop, implement, and evaluate innovative outreach strategies to increase WIC awareness, participation, benefit redemption, and reduce disparities in program delivery. Up to \$10 million will be available under this WIC CIAO Subgrant RFA. Submit a letter of intent by February 9. Applications are due March 23, 2023. Apply here.
