Program Overview

- □ Review the Cancer Prevention and Early Detection (CPED) <u>website</u>.
- □ Review the CQI-specific primary activity, sub-activities, and standards and requirements that will be added to the statement of work.
- □ Review the <u>CQI chapter</u> of the <u>Program Manual</u>.

Communication

- □ Contact <u>your agency lead or strategy lead</u> for technical assistance, as necessary.
- □ Sign up CQI staff for <u>the Cancer Prevention and Early Detection and WISEWOMAN Weekly Update</u>, if not already subscribed.

Roles and Responsibilities

- □ Identify the implementation team
 - Identify the CQI Strategy Lead. This could be anyone who works in the clinical setting with experience working on an interdisciplinary team and quality improvement initiatives. This does not need to be the Primary Program Contact.
 - Identify the CQI Strategy Team. This includes setting realistic expectations around time and effort for implementation of different activities and evidence-based interventions, and identifying who will be involved and in what capacity. This could also include identifying champions who can support the initiatives specific to cancer screening.
- Create a plan for involving and engaging agency leadership in the CQI initiatives on an ongoing basis.

Tips for Implementing a Successful CQI Strategy

- Choose and use a formal model for <u>QI</u>
- Establish and monitor metrics to evaluate improvement efforts and outcomes routinely
- Ensure all Strategy team members understand the metrics for success
- Ensure that patients, families, providers, and care team members are involved in QI activities
- Optimize use of an EHR and health IT
- Implement evidence-based interventions to improve cancer screening
