

# North Carolina Program Boosts Colorectal Cancer Screening Rates

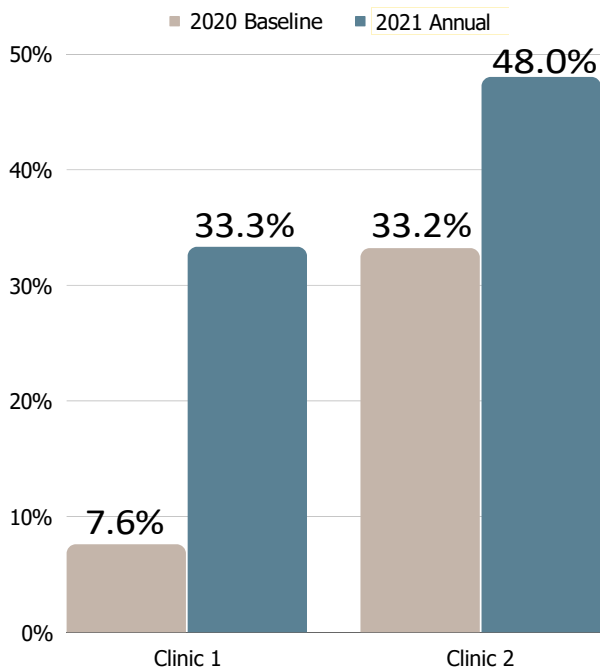


North Carolina Partnership to Increase Colorectal Cancer Screenings (NC PICCS)



Clinic 1 increased colorectal cancer screening rates by 25.6% from baseline. Clinic 2 increased colorectal cancer screening rates by 14.7% from baseline.

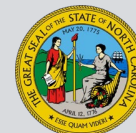
