



# Minnesota Food and Nutrition Security State Profile

# Overview

According to the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA</u> <u>ERS)</u>, 7% of households in Minnesota (MN) experienced food insecurity between 2018-2020. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in Minnesota was 30.7% in 2020 as reported by the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS).

## **Demographic Overview**

2019 U.S. Census data reports Minnesota has an estimated population of 5.63 million. They identify as White (83.8%), Black (7%), American Indian and Alaska Native (1.4%), Asian (5.2%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.1%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 5.6% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 9% of Minnesota residents experienced poverty in 2019.

# **Building Resilient Inclusive Communities (BRIC) - MN BRIC** Communities

The following counties will be prioritized by the MN BRIC project: Aitkin County and White Earth Nation.

## **Food Banks, Pantries and Feeding Programs**

There are six food banks that serve Minnesota. They all operate the Farm to Food Shelf program, which re-directs produce that would otherwise go unharvested by Minnesota growers into the emergency hunger relief system.

- Second Harvest Heartland
  - Operates the Summer Food Service Program, Commodity Supplemental Food Program, and SNAP outreach.
  - Partners with health clinics to operate FOOD Rx programs.

  - Operates a backpack program, a mobile pantry program, and a senior food box program.

- North Country Food Bank, Inc
  - Serves White Earth Nation.
  - Operates backpack programs, TEFAP, and the Summer Food Service Program.

- Second Harvest North Central Food Bank
  - Serves Aitkin County.
  - Operates a senior food box program, backpack programs, school pantries, and conducts SNAP outreach.

- <u>Channel One Regional Food Bank</u>
  - Provides grocery delivery, TEFAP, SNAP outreach, mobile pantries, a senior food box program, and a backpack program.

- Great Plains Food Bank
  - Operates summer meal programs, backpack programs, school pantries, a mobile food pantry, CSFP, and SNAP outreach.

  - Provides TEFAP, nutrition education, mobile pantries, Fare for All, and farmer education.
