



# **Ohio Food and Nutrition Security State Profile**

## Overview

According to the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA ERS)</u>, 11.6% of households in Ohio (OH) experienced food insecurity between 2018-2020. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in Ohio was 35.5% in 2020 as reported by the <u>Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)</u>.

## **Demographic Overview**

2019 U.S. Census data reports Ohio has an estimated population of 11.68 million. They identify as White (81.7%), Black (13.1%), American Indian and Alaska Native (0.3%), Asian (2.5%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.1%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 4% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 13.1% of Ohio residents experienced poverty in 2019.

## Food Banks, Pantries and Feeding Programs

  - Serves Franklin and Marion Counties.
  - Operates SNAP Assistance, a farm, South Side Roots Cafe, Summer Food Service Program, and has a food pharmacy.
  - Partnered with Franklin County Public Health to assist in getting produce to individuals getting their COVID-19 vaccination.
- Toledo Northwestern Ohio Food Bank
  - Serves Lucas County.
  - Operates SNAP outreach, a Backpack Program, the Summer Food Service Program, and a mobile market program.
