



# Pennsylvania Food and Nutrition Security State Profile

# Overview

According to the <u>U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA ERS)</u>, 9.9% of households in Pennsylvania (PA) experienced food insecurity between 2018-2020. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in Pennsylvania was 31.5% in 2020 as reported by the <u>Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS)</u>.

## **Demographic Overview**

2019 U.S. Census data reports Pennsylvania has an estimated population of 12.80 million. They identify as White (81.6%), Black (12%), American Indian and Alaska Native (0.4%), Asian (3.8%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.1%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 7.8% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 12% of Pennsylvania residents experienced poverty in 2019.
