





Washington Food and Nutrition Security State Profile

Overview

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Economic Research Service (USDA ERS), 9.9% of households in Washington (WA) experienced food insecurity between 2017-2019. The prevalence of obesity among adults living in Washington was 29.3% in 2019 as reported by the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS).

Demographic Overview

2019 U.S. Census data reports Washington has an estimated population of 7.61 million. They identify as White (78.5%), Black (4.4%), American Indian and Alaska Native (1.9%), Asian (9.6%), Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (0.8%) only. According to the 2019 Census report, 13% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 9.8% of Washington residents experienced poverty in 2019.
