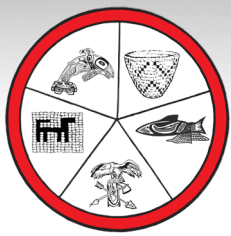




Orinda Goddard, Confederated Tribes of the Chehalis Reservations

My name is Orinda, and I know the pain of losing a family member too soon to colorectal cancer. My family had never heard of colorectal cancer until my uncle was told he had it. We didn't know there was something we could do to protect ourselves, our family, and our community from colorectal cancer. All Native American people are at risk. Don't let your family lose you, too. **If you're between the ages of 45 and 75, talk to your provider about colorectal cancer screening.**
